## THE MARCH MEETING


With 40 people attending, the meeting was so full of content that we had to reschedule one of the presentations.

JOE SIMPSON showed pictures of his Zenith 750 STOL airplane. The Zenith kits are easy to build with CNC cut pieces and matched drilled holes. He offers advice - saying that a good project starts with building good work ta-

bles. He also suggested good steel saw horses that are adjustable to allow for accurate leveling. He started with a traditional bubble level but evolved to a digital level that is accurate to 0.1 of a degree.

Joe has equipped his metal airplane with an Angle Of Attack indicator and long-range 15-gallon wing tanks. The Wings, Fuselage, Power and avionics are near completion but will not be ready in time to fly to Oshkosh. Pictures show an instrument panel that looks good and is equipped with an Auto Pilot.

ADAM TIPPIN is well along on his KR2-S. This is





Lots of clamps! Adam showed pictures of his airframe with dozens of clamps required to hold the glue joints in place until they dry. No nails! One of his pictures of the plywood siding showed his use of a row of staples on top of a string. When the glue dried, he would pull the string to remove the staples.

He modified his plans to allow for a wider cockpit. To allow for the extra bend in the sides Adam constructed the sides on a curved tabletop to prevent stressing the glued joints bending the sides to meet at the tail. That resulted in some complex angles and extra woodwork. The pictures show quality workmanship and care to make the measurements precise.

While the crowds are exiting and heading for their cars we can visit over a cool draft and talk about our favorite attractions.


George Douglas will share an AMS OIL tent at the south side door of the big blue metal vendor building and is a good place to stash a chair and visit during the day.
