EAA Chapter 17 Flight Training Scholarship Application (revised 12/2024) Flight Training Scholarships are intended for United States citizens 16 to 19 years old. Funds received from this scholarship must be used within the United States at an accredited flight training school or chapter approved training. Funds pay for flight training, aircraft rental/insurance, fuel, written exam fees as well as check ride fees. Scholarship funds cannot be used for any travel or lodging expenses. Training must begin within 60 days of email notification date of scholarship selection. Any funds not used within one year of notification date will be returned to EAA Chapter 17.

If you are selected, Chapter 17 will issue the scholarship funds directly to the flight school or approved instructor. The applicant will need to send Chapter 17's scholarship committee a monthly update of training. This could consist of a copy of your logbook, or email statement from your instructor.
